Job summary

Contributing towards CPRE's policy and campaigning work on spatial planning through providing high quality research and information, as well as training and support to planning representatives in the wider CPRE network

Scope

- Makes operational decisions on the day to day project management and delivery of research, campaign and policy outputs
- Helps develop policy, research and campaign strategies and will consult with Head of Land Use &
 Planning on decision making with wider team implications
- Produces policy and campaign briefings and communications for the CPRE network, public and supporter audiences
- Represents CPRE occasionally in political and public fora, primarily in a focused planning policy context
- Makes some recommendations on policy and campaigns strategy to key internal stakeholders particularly the CPRE network
