WHAT WE DO



Policy, Campaigns & Public Affairs

We develop research-led, joined-up policy solutions and reports on the issues we care about.

We lead national campaigns, send stories to the media and run lobbying events to influence policy makers.

We expand how people can take action for the countryside through volunteering, participation and through the CPRE network. We work to amplify younger and more diverse voices within our movement. We support the CPRE network and how we work together. We manage and coordinate our Hedgerow Heroes project with local groups.

Planning

We lead the work of the <u>Better</u>
<u>Planning Coalition</u> - a coalition of 34
organisations across the environment,
housing, planning, heritage and
transport sectors advocating for a
planning system fit for climate, nature
and people. What gets built where
plays a big part in our work.

We generate income to support our work and we develop <u>CPRE</u> membership, as well as delivering customer care for CPRE's members, supporters and network.

Communications

We utilise a range of communications to raise awareness and drive engagement with our brand and campaigns, including engaging with national and local media.

We are a federated charity - the CPRE network consists of around 40 local groups at county level across England. Nearly all are independent charities with their own Trustee boards.


At national CPRE we undertake policy, campaigning, recruitment, fundraising, marketing and media work. We also help develop and advise the network of local CPREs and provide services to members.

Local CPRE groups undertake their own work, for example on planning issues locally, and there are lots of exciting projects going on across the network.

Together, we've been campaigning for the countryside for almost a century. The local knowledge and expertise of CPRE groups combined with the influence national CPRE can exert on decision-makers, gives us a strong and respected voice for the countryside.

Hedgerow Heroes

Help us to plant and restore 100 miles of hedgerows across the country by the end of 2026, and support our campaign to extend the UK hedgerows network by 40% by 2050.



Magnificent Meadows

Carry out traditional management such as scything, making hay by hand and gathering seed to restore and enhance local meadows.



Litter Picking

Carry out litter picks on a regular basis in the green spaces close to where you live, helping your local community and making it safer for wildlife.



Citizen Science

Collect data and contribute to the bigger picture by monitoring water quality or mapping light pollution
